CLASSIC 3 PM

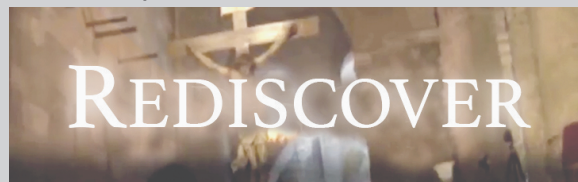
