Just last week, the Holy Father traveled to Myanmar, the southeast Asian nation at the center of an L international outcry for the "ethnic cleansing" of the Rohingya-Bangladeshi Muslim minorities. The Pope reminded the people of Myanmar that "the arduous process of peacebuilding and national reconciliation can only advanced through a commitment to justice and respect for human rights." Meanwhile, in the United States, we ourselves struggle with certain efforts to withdraw legal support for 60,000 Haitians and 200,000 El Salvadorans residing here legally as a result of a 1990 era law known as TPS (Temporary Protective Status). The movement of peoples is becoming one of the great moral questions for our own age. Pope Pius XII wrote "the Lord entrusts to the Church's motherly love every person forced to leave their homeland in search of a better future" and Pope Francis reaffirms the obligation of every Christian to "welcome, to protect, to promote and to integrate" the stranger who knocks at our door. May God bless you.
