

# 700 YEARS SEEKING FORGIVENESS 4:30 PM

A Rome Reports documentary exploring the various holy years, and the history of the four Major Basilicas in Rome and the significance of each of the four holy doors. Joaquin Navarro-Valls, spokesman for Pope John Paul II, gives us firsthand details.

This past week the Holy Father invited the leaders of religious faiths from around the world to join him in Assisi and pray for peace. It was the Community of Sant'Egidio who organized the first World Day of Prayer for Peace in 1986, which was attended by Pope John Paul II. This week is the opening of the UN General Assembly and given the experiences of terrorism in our own city this week, the need for peace is more apparent than ever. Pope Francis reminds us that "We pray to the Lord, so that He gives us a heart of peace, beyond religious differences, because we are all children of God...It's necessary to pray, even to cry for peace, with all the faithful united in the conviction that God is a God of peace."
